Overview

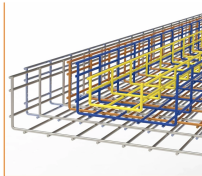

At times it becomes necessary, or even desirable, to route medium- or high-voltage cables (greater than 600V) in the same cable tray with cables rated 600V or less.
