

Long-distance optical cables suffer from high optical attenuation

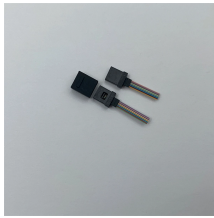


Overview

Optical fibers are a key component in modern communication systems, carrying signals over long distances. Attenuation in fiber optics is the gradual loss of light signal strength as it travels through a fiber cable. It's measured in decibels per kilometer (dB/km), and it determines how far a signal can travel before it becomes too weak to read. A standard single-mode fiber operating at 1550 nm loses. Signal attenuation is one of the most critical factors affecting the performance of fiber optic cabling. This signal degradation limits the maximum distance.
