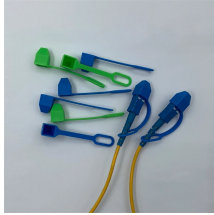

Choose the right box based on environment (indoor/outdoor), load capacity, and durability. Check for proper IP/NEMA ratings and material quality. Panelboards shall be installed in accordance with the listing of the panelboard. The conductors and equipment required or permitted by this subpart shall be acceptable only if approved, as defined in § 1910. The width of the working space can be measured from left-to-right, from right-to-left, or simply centered on the equipment.



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Circuit breakers marked “Line” and “Load” must be installed per listing or labeling instructions [Sec. 110.3 (B)]. These types of devices are therefore not permitted to be back-fed.



(E) Except for underground box covers that weigh over 45.4 kg (100 lb), doors and covers of enclosures used solely as pull boxes, splice boxes, or junction boxes shall be locked, bolted, or screwed on.
