Single-mode Cables Multimode and single-mode cables are the most common. Unlike copper wires, which are limited by lower data transmission speeds, shorter transmission distances, and higher susceptibility to electromagnetic interference, fiber optic cables offer unparalleled performance and can cover much greater distances without bumping up against signal degradation.

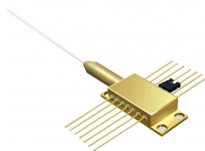
A 4 core fiber cable contains four individual optical fibers within a single cable jacket, allowing for multiple simultaneous data transmissions or redundancy in a network.



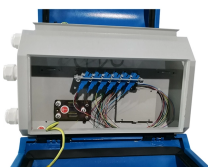

A fiber-optic cable, also known as an optical-fiber cable, is an assembly similar to an electrical cable but containing one or more optical fibers that are used to carry light.



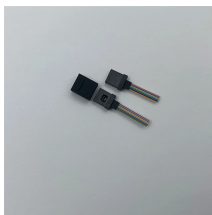

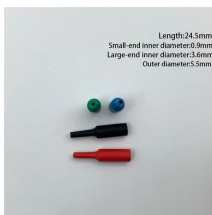
